Coming of age on a farm near the northwest lowa community of Sheldon, Kirk encountered an overabundance of pigs and corn, but his family also took on a steady diet of music and theatre performances thanks in part to an ambitious high school program marshalled by Jay Shelp.

Kirk went on to major in Speech Communication Education and minor in Music at Iowa State University. He spent summers on staff at the Sheldon Community High School Summer Theatre as a play director and master carpenter. His first appearance as a speech coach and classroom teacher was at Hoover High School in Des Moines during the fall of 1992. Kirk and his wife Shana bought a home and raised their children (Ashton, Pryce, and Sage) in the Beaverdale neighborhood where they still live today. He completed a Master of Arts in Speech Communication Education through the University of Northern Iowa in the spring of 2000 which allowed him to pursue adjunct work in the evenings and summers at DMACC. He was the director of debate and forensics for 11 years, and the drama assistant to Denis Hildreth for 16 years before transferring to the Central Campus Regional Career Academy in downtown Des Moines.

Kirk's past contributions to the IHSSA outside of coaching include committee work for the IE All-State Festival, the Judge Certification Committee, and he assisted with hosting IHSSA contests at all levels. He continues to serve as the guest presiding officer in the awards house at the IHSSA State Debate Tournament held each January. For several years Kirk could be found backstage at the opening and closing ceremonies of the Large Group All-State events passing along sound cues each time Craig Ihnen shot him a stern and urgent glance.

He currently serves as a Broadcasting and Film Instructor and General Manager of the student-run radio station KDPS 88.1 FM. He has performed in community theatre productions and sings regularly in the Plymouth Chancel Choir. He is eternally grateful to the IHSSA for the wealth of activities that continue to validate the lives of students and promote the values he respects and enjoys.

B.J. was born and raised in West Bend (home of the Grotto), where he graduated in 1982. While at West Bend, he was first exposed to speech and theater as a freshman in 1978 by a first-year speech and English teacher fresh out of Wartburg College. Following high school graduation, he attended Northwestern College in Orange City for two years on a football

scholarship as a Speech/Theater major. A combination that raised eyebrows on both sides of the fence. He played a role in "A Christmas Carol" while there, and was a player on the 1983 national championship football team. 1982 was also the year he became certified as an IHSSA judge. Following his sophomore year he transferred to the University of South Dakota in Vermillion, South Dakota where he taught public speaking and received his BS in secondary education.

B.J. began his professional career as a full-time residence hall director at USD and at Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona where he was named the 1989 Hall Director of the Year. In 1990, he moved the family to Mobridge, South Dakota where he began his high school teaching career. While in Mobridge, he directed several plays and took the speech program from two participants to 55 by the fourth year and was named "Teacher of the Year". He also worked with the SD Executive Director to introduce Reader's Theatre to the state's competitions. The next move was to Manson, lowa where he was shared between Manson-Northwest Webster and Rockwell City-Lytton high schools. Once again, he took two moderate programs and built their ranks tenfold. In 2001, the family then moved to Sibley. He is currently in his 22nd year at Sibley-Ocheyedan High School and has been teaching for 33 years.

B.J. has stayed active with the IHSSA throughout the years by serving as a District Officer and also on the Judge Certification Committee as well as the Convention Committee. While he never thought to keep an actual count, he has hosted district and state-level contests multiple times for the students of the IHSSA.
