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Nominations

After the contest, each judge nominates as many students as they classify "outstanding performers" from the day. Each entry a student performs with is eligible for nomination. A student MUST receive at least two nominations out of the three judges to be considered nominated. Judge nominations are confidential; only the committee members will see the information.



Selection/Sorting Process

After contest, the All-State Committee meets to sort the data. Nominations are sorted by the number of nominations received per student, performing category, and school. The sorting continues when the nominations are matched with performance spots, and a schedule is created.



Performing/Nonperforming

There are two categories for All-State: Performing and Nonperforming. If a student receives a nonperforming recognition, it is not a bad thing! Simply put...sometimes we have too many outstanding performers and not enough performing spots. Nonperforming receives the same recognition, banner, medals, etc as performing participants.
