

ALL-STATE HISTORY

Submitted by Vince Williams, IHSSA Judge and Former IHSSA All-State Committee

I was teacher of Speech and Dramatic Arts and Director for all plays presented by Dubuque Hempstead High School from 1971 through 2000. During that time we held an annual one-act play-writing contest in which the top three plays and their student playwrights won "Oscar-like" statue awards they could keep. In some measure it was the success of this tangible symbol that helped prompt my ideas for All-State recognition. In the 1970's and 80's I was a member of the All-State Committee planning how the highest honors, or performance achievements in the IHSSA series of speech and drama competition could best be awarded and made most effective. I devised the point system (which has since been somewhat adjusted and changed). But recalling my experience with the success of the statue awards mentioned above, I suggested the concept of the traveling banners. I had been a sketch artist much of my life and when the Committee, as a whole, decided to authorize the banners idea, I set about to sketch a possible design. From that design, the current banners were further developed – one for each group category. All-State Critic Recipient schools are permitted to display the impressive banner throughout the year which is a continuing object of pride and incentive towards further achievement.

If there is no title such as in Group Improv, TV News, or Radio Broadcasting you start then with SCHOOL, listing of students' names, then the coach's name(s).

RADIO/SHORT FILM/TV 2026

All RADIO/SHORT FILM/TV entries at Large Group All-State Festival will be submitted via a Google Form from the IHSSA.

3. You will not need to bring your own projector/speakers.

Notification of All-State nominations will be on the web site. In addition, a large envelope mailed USPS with many All-State materials will be sent to the IHSSA Coach of each school that qualifies for the Festival. That packet will be shipped out of the State Office on Monday and should reach every school in the state by Thursday or when your USPS is delivered. This packet will contain the All-State notification letters and wristbands for each participant and coach(s).

Any school that has students qualifying for the All-State Festival as performers or special recognition will receive free wristbands. Any IHSSA coach in the state that wishes to attend the Festival will be admitted free. Coaches need to contact the State Office, and a wristbands will be sent to respective schools if you wish to attend when you do not have students that qualify.

Wristbands must be worn at all times by all coaches and participants attending the Festival. Be sure to tell your students to not remove their band even if they are performing.

Maps, hotel numbers, and room information about the ISU Center and other items are available on the IHSSA website.

REMINDER: All spectators will be sold ONLINE through BOUND TICKETING. This link will be available at the IHSSA website. All spectators MUST purchase an online ticket. If spectators do not have an online ticket, they must purchase one at the All-State Festival. This will be enforced.

Cost for the Festival is \$12 per person, for ages 5+. There are no discounts for senior citizens. The \$12 cost is for the entire day or for any part of the day.

Free programs/green ribbons for the Festival will be distributed at check in at the Scheman Building. Plan on checking in at the Scheman Building to receive your free programs. Programs for spectators will be sold as in the past for \$5.

The ISU Center is not available as a 'landing area' for students. There are plenty of spaces to hang out and put your coats in the coat check or in an area for your school. We ask that materials for performance such as steps and blocks be brought into the respective buildings a performance or two before you go on and then returned to your bus or van immediately after your performance. We do not have the room to store these types of materials at the ISU Center. Since there is no problem with parking at the ISU Center and there are great drop off lanes, your bus driver should have no problem with this.

Note on All-State nominations:

Please remember that just receiving straight I's at State does NOT mean you are nominated for All-State. At the end of the day judges must nominate events they believe are worthy of All-State. Two judges must nominate you for the All-State honor. There are many groups with straight I ratings that are not performers at All-State. We suggest you explain this to your students and parents.

Inclement weather at All-State:

Please remember if All-State Festivals encounter weather concerns and they are cancelled, no make-up will be done because of the sites and time schedules. It is not imperative to attend the festival in order to receive your medals. If you cannot attend the festival, medals and programs will be sent to you at your school. Please remember the All-State is a festival and not a contest!

ROYALTIES APPLY AT FESTIVAL as well as all CONTESTS:

It is the duty and the responsibility of the director to secure appropriate production rights for all material presented in IHSSA contest series including festivals. If you have any questions on this, please refer to page 13 of the Constitution, or call the State Office.

FESTIVAL and CONTEST DECORUM:

Please remember that we are guests in the schools and at the universities that are hosting contest/festival. It is incumbent on every coach to be aware of what their students are doing and how they are behaving at that particular contest. At no time is there any place for a student from your school to take it upon themselves to damage the contest school environment or the festival site.

NO PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOTAPING at CONTESTS/FESTIVALS.

Please remember that videotaping/photography is not allowed at IHSSA Contests/ Festivals.

DONATION REQUEST

At all contests (IE and LG) a suggested donation will be asked of all spectators to help out the local contest site with other expenses. That suggested donation is \$5 per person. All student contestants, coaches, and drivers will not be asked to pay this donation. Be sure to inform your parents and other spectators that this \$5 donation will be anticipated at the door of each contest site this year. All-State is a fee of \$12 for the day.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

Weather information for contest days will always be posted on the IHSSA web site front page. Be sure to check the web site if there is a problem or concern. If a contest site operates, it becomes the responsibility of the member school to decide to attend or not attend. The school has the right to choose not to attend, however NO make-up contests will be arranged for schools that choose not to attend. District and State contests will be rescheduled since they are a contest and not a Festival. Please understand your local school always has the right and final decision whether or not to attend a contest due to weather concerns. Please remember - coming to the contest later is always an option. If an entire contest is rescheduled then that is the final date for the contest and a school will have to go to contest on that date.

READ THE RULES

Every year a group or a student is given a DQ because the school did not carefully read the rules for the event! It is best to review the rules for each category as students begin their rehearsals. If not already done, please take a moment before you travel to contest to go over all the rules together. It will be worth the time and you will be glad you did. Plus, many eyes looking at the rules makes for correct application of the rules for your events. Also be sure to read the rules and regulations in the front part of the Constitution. **TAKE THE TIME TO READ THE RULES!!!**


CONTEST DEADLINES

Deadlines will be strictly enforced. Many times individuals start their entry the day it is due and then run into problems. Do not wait until the last moment to complete your registrations. You will still be charged a late fee if materials are not submitted on time.



Need **COMMENT SHEETS**? Print copies of these NOW. Use them in your rehearsals. Do not wait until the last moment to print these. [Click HERE](#). (District = 1 judge = 1 comment sheet. 1 Act = 3 judges = 3 comment sheets. State = 3 judges = 3 comment sheets.)

SCHEDULES for CONTEST: will be posted at [IHSSA.org](#). Click **CONTESTS**. Then, choose either **DISTRICT** or **STATE**. Each Contest Manager will also send the contest schedule to each director via email. Coaches should send each contest manager their email to receive the schedule. Directors: make sure you have communicated with your contest manager to receive the schedule.



VIDEOTAPING/PHOTOGRAPHY is NOT allowed at contest. This includes any type of recording device. Please pass this important information onto your parents/spectators. This policy is effective for ALL IHSSA contests and festivals.

IHSSA ELIGIBILITY

By directive of the Executive Board, please remember all students in all events must be academically eligible. This includes students in Short Film, Radio, and TV. All students must be eligible when the short film is given at contest. If a student was ineligible when it was filmed and is not eligible on the date of the contest, that film cannot be shown at contest. **YOU CANNOT USE AN INELIGIBLE CONTESTANT IN IHSSA ACTVITIES.** If you need more clarification call the State Office. 
MUSICAL THEATRE: Please note "NO UNIFORMITY of ATTIRE." Students can NOT dress the same. However, rehearsal black attire is allowed.



SHORT FILM: Credits are part of the timing. Make sure you have timed your schools' short films and critically reviewed them prior to contest.



RADIO BROADCASTING: You may have one or more commercials for a total of 30- 45 seconds. You cannot interview an outside school person for your broadcast. You may have one of your students portray a person; however, it MUST be a high school member and an eligible member of the team that is presenting the Radio Broadcast.



TV NEWS: You may have one or more commercials under the total time of 120 seconds.

CHORAL READING/READERS THEATRE SCRIPTS: Scripts MUST be identifiable. Use the script with purpose. Make sure it is easily seen and serves the story.



ONTIME: You must be ONTIME with your REGISTRATION. If you do not submit entries on time, your entries may be scheduled at the end of the day.

JUDGE EVALUATION FORM



Your voice is important! After every contest the Judge Certification Committee asks for your insight and assistance in completing the "Judge Evaluation Forms". Here's why ...

Each August, the Judge Certification Committee thoroughly examines each and every individual evaluation form. Judges who have earned superior feedback receive positive affirmation from the State Office. Judges that are in need of support receive extra guidance and clarification. Your assessment makes the whole process circular -- our judges "judge" our students and we "judge" our judges. Also, this is your opportunity to model and exercise "justification". Ultimately this system of giving and receiving constructive feedback is better for the whole community: judges, coaches, and most importantly -- our students. Additionally, your evaluation assists the Judge Certification Committee in collecting information for areas that are in need of training and/or areas that require more clarification. Your feedback aids in the thoughtfulness of continued education to judges on the rules as well as how to properly interpret and justify the IHSSA Constitution.

We kindly ask that you complete a judge evaluation form as close to the end of each contest day as possible. Your thoughts will be fresh in your mind before you encounter your next contest day and your next round of judges. Your Contest Manager will include a reminder and specific instructions for completing the "Judge Evaluation Forms" with your ballots.



- 1. Your Contest Manager will supply you with the LIST of JUDGES at Contest.**
- 2. Complete an evaluation for each judge.**

IE UPDATES

Repeating IE Events

Anyone who received a Division “I” rating at the state contest may repeat in that same individual event. If an individual received an Outstanding performance award, they may return in the same event the next year. They **MUST** use a different selection.

IE Musical Theatre: 3 Entries Acting: 3 Entries.

NEW THIS YEAR: Each school is only allowed 3 Musical Theatre entries and 3 Acting entries. In Musical Theatre, the Roomchair will give the intro information and the performer will then start into their selection. The student will **NEVER** give an intro in musical theatre!

IE Musical Theatre

If you are using sheet music for this event please remember you can **NEVER** rearrange the music or change the score. The presentation must be what you purchased as the sheet music. You must always start at the beginning of the song. The IHSSA will not support any school that does not get permission to perform materials or cuttings in contest.

Directive Statement

The following statement will be shared with every judge that is judging IHSSA District Contest. The judge will be asked to read this statement before they are to judge that day. The Executive Committee believes it is important for all coaches to read this statement before they head into District Contest.

Speech Coaches, Judges, and the Executive Committee of the IHSSA advocate that judging (especially at the district level) needs to be discerning on the quality of student performances advancing into state level competition. If entire sections advance to state, even when there is an evident difference in performance-levels within the section, or a judge awards a proportionately higher number of “I” ratings over the “II” rating, then we need to exercise greater discernment as to what is worthy of advancing to State.

An over-inflated number of students from the District level advancing to State diminishes each student's sense of the value of his/her accomplishment. If everybody advances, what has been won too easily means little. As a result, a belief could develop that students need not prepare for District, only State; and we, as judges, lower our expectations rather than expect contestants to refine their communication skills. Discernment means we must set levels of accomplishment suited for the District level, suited for high school participants, and encourage students to those levels of performance.

++ UPDATES

Invoices & Payments

Please remember to make a copy of your on-line entry form and give to your bookkeeper. This form is the invoice for your contest entry fees. Nothing will be sent from this office for payment of contest fees. Please do your part and get that form to the office that handles your finances. Many times we have schools that we have to contact to pay their fees. Please submit your fees in a timely manner.

No "Switching"

Coaches are advised that you can't switch your entries at the contest site without approval of the IHSSA State Office or the local contest manager. An example of this would be School A has three Solo Mimes at contest. Number 1 is at 10:00, Number 2 is at 11:30 and Number 3 is at 3:30. School A coach goes into the contest office and says that Solo Mime Number 3 will now be at 10:00 and Number 1 will now be at 3:30. Unless School A's coach has written permission from the State Office, he/she cannot switch times.

The rationale for this rule is that contest managers have a very difficult job putting a contest together and then reporting it correctly to the IHSSA State Office. When schools switch performing times among themselves, it causes the contest manager's job to become even more difficult.

Entry Forms

Be sure to take your time in correctly filling out your school's entry forms. Please read all of the directions for on-line registration before you start.

If you have a 9th grade team entry, take the time to fill out both a Sr. eligibility, Jr. eligibility, and separate fee payment forms. You may, however, send the entire payment in one check. Submit your invoices immediately to your bookkeeper for payment.

Also remember that you cannot mix students between the Jr. and Sr. memberships. All 9th graders must be in the Jr. membership and only 10-12 graders can be in the Sr. membership if your school has two memberships.

EDUCATE your SPECTATORS

Please share this information and video with your parents/guardians.

[PREPARE SPECTATORS](#)



1. Are performance times exact? No. Plan on arriving to your student's center at least 1/2 hour early. Most often, centers run ahead of time.

2. Is videotaping and photography allowed? No videotaping or photography is permissible. In fact, it may disqualify the performing school.

3. Can local school logo (ie. a sweatshirt with school logo) be worn by spectators? No. Refrain from all apparel that informs the judge of what school the participants are from.

4. Are students permitted to leave after they are finished performing?

ALL teams and students are encouraged to support other schools' performances. The big "team" is the whole "IHSSA Family."

5. What are the qualifications of the judges? All IHSSA judges have gone through training and certification. Please accept your student's ratings with pride and dignity. Adhere to proper sportsmanship at all times.

6. How are ratings given? At Districts, one judge critiques the performance with a I, II, III, or Disqualification IV rating. The judge also gives an oral critique. Only those receiving a I rating advance to State. At State, three judges critique the performance. No oral critique is given. Only those performances that receive at least two All-State nominations AND also are in the upper percentages of point ratings advance to All-State.



7. If I don't know where/when my student performs, what should I do? DO make sure you DO know ahead of time from your local speech department your student's times and locations. These 10 areas will produce the questions for the 2026 Spontaneous Speaking category for both District and State Contest. Please note these are NOT the questions, just areas for students to conduct their research.

1. National government issues and their effects on the average person in America.
2. Security issues in our schools, our nation, and in the world.
3. The economy in America and the world.
4. Laws and rules that relate to students.
5. Media's effects on our lives.
6. Health issues including mental health issues.
7. The President, Congress and the state of government in the United States.
8. Business issues including local, state, national, and international issues.
9. Educational issues facing our youth.
10. Current/past art and sporting events.



Possible questions could be:

What is the biggest issue for our students in schools today? Is America safe from terrorism? Can we restore civility to political debate?

SHORT FILM, TV NEWSCASTING, RADIO BROADCASTING REMINDER

As per the IHSSA Constitution, you must provide your own media formatted presentation. The contest site will have a backup just in case something happens to your projector or computer; however, it is your responsibility to bring your own equipment. Each individual school is responsible for bringing their own AV equipment in SHORT FILM, TV NEWSCASTING, and RADIO BROADCASTING. Do not rely on the contest manager supplying these for you. Do not rely on the contest school's WIFI.

BRING TO CONTEST: Your own projector

- Your own multiple copies of your Short Film/TV/Radio
- Your own extension chords
- Your own extra speakers (if you have)
- Your own extra cart (if you have)



If you bring your own equipment, you will have no problems showing these events. We have had some issues with this in the past. Please bring your own equipment to show your presentations. What each site will have is a cart to set up your equipment in the hallway before each presentation. When your event is ready to go, you wheel the cart in and your presentation will be set. There will be no setting up equipment in the room. This should help those events run smoothly. If you are using music for short film, tv news, or radio broadcasting you must get rights from the copyright holder and get synchronization rights for that music. **DO NOT USE MUSIC WITHOUT THOSE RIGHTS!**

****NOTE on timing of the Short Film: Credits ARE a part of the time. If you show credits, yes, they do count as part of the time.**
